During the summer I had the wonderful opportunity of getting back on to a Motorbike again. I used to own my own bike, and it was something I thought I would never do





The MS Service is always there to help and support you if you have any questions, concerns or sudden changes in your condition.

- If you call The Helpline on the number above at the times shown you will be able to talk to a member of The MS Service Team (Neurophysiotherapist, Occupational Therapist or MS Nurse)
- If the phone line is engaged, it means that The Team member, on The Rota that day, is dealing with another call and you will go through to The Answering Machine
- Leave a clear message specifying the urgency of the matter and a member of The Team will endeavour to get back to you ASAP
- Messages are prioritised and urgent calls are returned first. (it is not necessarily first come, first served)
- If you prefer to use e-mail you can contact The Team using servicepht@poole.nhs.uk

If you experience a sudden worsening of your condition outside of the above hours contact your General Practitioner.

Three years ago we took tentative steps to have the Citizens Advice Bureau attend The Centre.

Every Thursday Tish Borrowman came and saw MS members and helped them with advice on employment, housing, benefits and form filling. The monthly cost to the branch was £500, so the hope was that the service Tish provided was going to be of great benefit to our members and their families.

After six months we had the first review of The Service and the headline was that over £66,000 had been recouped to those members using The Service. We were amazed, to say the least, and when the annual review came and the figure for the year was over £140,000 we didn't hesitate in renewing the contract.

This month was the 3rd anniversary of the service and every six month review has seen an increase in the amount recouped to our members. This last review showed financial gains of over £131,000, for six months, astonishing!!!!

Needless to say we didn't hesitate in renewing the contract and our thanks must go to Tish, and her manager Richard Bristow, for providing a service that has eased the lives of a lot of members.

Our first ever Charity Golf day was a massive success. Raising close to £2500 we were blessed with a glorious day and thanks to the months of planning and organising by Dave Thompson and Jenny Alderson, everything ran very smoothly and was enjoyed by all who participated. We are planning next years, and it will be bigger!!!!

As Christmas approaches I'll take this opportunity to thank all our members, our staff and volunteers for making The Osborne Centre the place that it is. Long may it continue!!!








Out in The Country

Countryside Mobility have a number of Sites throughout the South West. They also include sites for Wheely boats, where you can hire a motor boat, to go up the river. Again, I did this with family, and it was great fun.

You can hire a boat with a driver or self-drive. We took the boat out from Wareham River and had a super time. The boat has a ramp that you wheel up a wheel chair or walker, it will fit in 5 chairs plus passengers, so a whole family can have a super day out messing about on the water!
